



Police officers, teachers, doctors, firefighters, lifeguards, detectives, astronauts, farmers, soldiers, and more fall into this category. This project aims to elucidate the ways in which community helpers contribute to our society.

The community helper I have selected is Dr. Deepti Lele, a cyber law expert, trainer, and counselor.

Om: What is cyber-crime?

Deepti: Cyber-crime refers to the use of electronic devices (computers, mobile phones, laptops) to steal someone's data or attempt to harm them.

Om: What do you do in your day-to-day work? **Deepti:** I am a cyber law expert. I work as a counselor with the Pune Police Cyber Cell.

Om: As a trainer, which workshops do you conduct? **Deepti:** I conduct various workshops tailored to different age groups:

- Cyber Pathshala for 1st to 4th standard kids
- Responsible Netizens for parents and grandparents who use the internet for online transactions
- "हसत खेळत सायबर जगाशी ओळख" for corporate offices. I derive real happiness from conducting free sessions in rural areas.



Om: During the Corona period, many teachers, parents, and students used the internet for the first time for online learning. What was your role during that period?

Deepti: Yes, that's a good question, Om. During the Corona period, we conducted many teacher training programs in both urban and rural areas. We ensured that online learning would be smooth and comply with all cyber security regulations.

Om: What facilities are provided by the Indian Government to report cyber-crime?

Deepti: There is a 24-hour helpline number "1930" available for reporting cyber-crime. You can call this number anytime, day or night, and cyber-crime experts will address your queries. Additionally, you can launch any complaint related to cyber security by writing an email to cybercrime.gov.in.

Om: Please share a memorable experience as a cyber law expert and counselor.

Deepti: I conduct counseling sessions in remand homes. After my counseling sessions, some students admitted their mistakes and deleted their fake accounts in front of the cyber cell. I felt happy witnessing their actions, making it a memorable moment for me.

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
